





## Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) Clinical Outreach Refresher Trainings (S-CORTs) for Crisis Settings

# An open-access resource for clinical trainers and workshop participants operating in humanitarian crises

The Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) Clinical Outreach Refresher Trainings (S-CORTs) are a series of training materials designed for clinical service providers working in crisis-affected contexts. Each training covers a set of lifesaving skills included in the standard of care known as the *Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP)* for SRH in Emergencies.

From 2015–2021, the Training Partnership Initiative (TPI) of the Inter-Agency Working Group (IAWG) on Reproductive Health in Crises and its partners – including leading authors CARE, Ipas, and Jhpiego – developed, piloted, evaluated, and revised the training materials and approach to align with provider needs and adherence with global guidelines and standards.

S-CORTs are available to strengthen the lifesaving knowledge and skills of clinical service providers in humanitarian crises on:

- Basic Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care: Select Signal Functions
- Clinical Management of Survivors of Sexual Violence
- Long-Acting Reversible Contraceptives
- Uterine Evacuation with Manual Vacuum Aspiration
- Uterine Evacuation with Medications


Basic Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care: Select Signal Functions

#### How and when should I use the S-CORTs?

The S-CORTs are adaptable materials for clinical trainers conducting brief, face-to-face onsite refresher trainings in diverse humanitarian contexts. Each training package contains resources for trainers and for workshop participants to make trainings participatory and skills focused, including:















Facilitator's guide

Participant workbook

Presentation slides

Job aids

Skills checklist

Videos

Evaluation tools

Training methodologies include lectures with slides, brainstorming, group discussions, case studies, small group activities, role plays, videos, demonstrations, and hands-on skills practice with anatomic models along with checklists to guide practice.

The S-CORTs are two- to three-day, interactive clinical competency-based trainings which can take place at or near where participants work to minimize their time away from SRH service provision. Whenever possible, training should be incorporated into broader capacity strengthening strategies, ongoing quality improvement activities, and existing curricula.

The S-CORTs are intended for use in emergency settings when the situation allows, and as part of emergency preparedness and recovery efforts, based on an assessment of opportunities and needs.
